Vuze Primary School

Vuze primary school is a government school that was established in 1966, it has 650 pupils, 300 boys and 350 girls (Pre-school to Grade 9). It is based in the Eastern Province of Zambia in a rural area of Chipata and the school is surrounded by 14 villages. 16% of the pupils are orphans or vulnerable and most of the parents/guardians who send their children to the school are peasant farmers who generate low incomes and also have the responsibility of providing for extended family members. The highly motivated pupils regularly perform at 30-40% in government exams in comparison to schools in the area.



Headteacher: Mr Stanley Chifafa

Information about the Headteacher: Mr Chifafa qualified as a teacher (Primary Education) at Chipata Teachers Training College in 1996. Since 1996 he has taught at various primary schools in the Eastern province of Zambia. In 2002 he obtained a diploma in teaching mathematics to the blind and taught at Magwero School for the blind until 2007. From 2008 he has held Deputy Headteacher and Headteacher positions at various primary schools also in Eastern province, Zambia. He currently works as the Headteacher of Vuze Primary School, a position that he has held since 2015.
